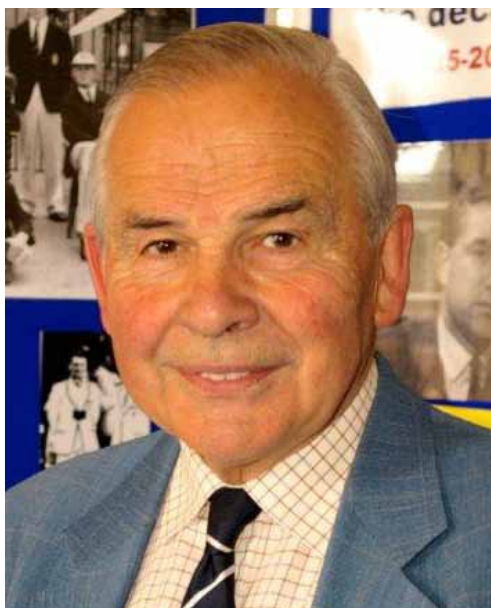
Ten years on, under the expert leadership of the Chairman, Hugh Scurfield, the Trust has made a significant contribution to the success and development of The King's School.

In the year covered by this report, we have been able to provide substantial support for a number of projects including providing financial assistance to 28 pupils at the school and £2.5 million to build the Michael Baker Boathouse complex which is now taking shape on the banks of the River Severn.

At the end of this report, we list all those who have been so generous over the past ten years. We are very grateful to all of you for everything you have made possible.

Chairman's Report

It is ten years since the Headmaster asked Carol Bawden to start a Foundation Development Office. She set the tone in those early years. We needed to establish a relationship with many more of our OVs and engage the School community so that in due course they might be willing to donate to the capital or bursary needs of the school. A school development trust had been dormant for a number of years and this was reactivated with new trustees representing OVs, staff, parents and governors. I was asked to be chairman for three years and am about to stand down after seven years in office. I am delighted that Andrew Reekes (Ch 64-69) has agreed to take on this role as of January 2012.

Over those early years OVs were encouraged to attend functions where we tried to arrange that they met up with those with whom they had been at school. The Annual OV Weekend has been attended by growing numbers and there have been more of these gatherings at other places. In recent years we have also started to involve parents.

While the achievements of the school have taken King's in many new directions, we wanted to remind our community of the aims and values of the school, many of which have not changed over the years. Many of us feel we were very fortunate to have been at the school, often as direct grant entries, and have come to realise that we owed the school a big debt for all that it had done for us. We felt that we would like to put something back into the school for the benefit of the next generations.

I remember walking out of College Hall after an OV dinner with two or three OVs and the conversation, not steered by me, centred on the problem of finding money for bursaries. There were very few OVs who could afford to pay for a whole bursary, but couldn't we get together as groups and make a regular modest gift aided donation so that collectively we could make a difference? That was actively followed up and currently the trust is paying for six bursaries from what we call the Fellowship Bursary Fund. That was a very pleasing outcome from that conversation, but one of those present, who had been at school with me and not been back since, went home wanting to make a real difference to the school that had meant so much to him. He was Michael Baker and he and his family have since given us £3½m, part for bursaries and part for the new boathouse. We had no idea that the Bakers were able to do this and could not have expected such generosity. It would be great to think there could be another, or even others, who would like to support us in this way.

At the back of this report, we list the many OVs and parents who have contributed but this only represents a small percentage of the King's community. It would be good to be able to motivate others to want to help the school.

Apart from seeing and feeling the achievements, enthusiasm and respect that are so visible at the school I am very impressed that the Governors have taken seriously the need to grow and update the buildings of the school on this lovely site around the cathedral and overlooking the river. Boarding houses have changed their use and that has helped. But

over the years the school has gradually acquired space on the near side of Severn Street and this had enabled us to grow while maintaining our city centre position. The result is a compact and friendly campus, still with College Green at the centre. It has been a very successful strategic development. With my rowing background I am delighted to see the new and exciting boat house going up as part of it. It will be complete just as I stand down. Just above it on Severn Street it is very satisfying that the Sports and Performing Arts Centre (SPACE) project is planned to start in 2013/14. These will be very welcome additions to the school.

I will miss the many friends that I have re-found through my work with the Trust but I will look back on a period when much has been achieved, as you can see from reading this report. As much as £7m has been raised or promised in this time, more than we could ever have hoped for in those early years. But there is still much more to do. In the course of the next year, we will be asking OVs and parents to help us achieve the ambitious and transformational SPACE project. I hope that even more of you will support the Trust as generously as you have over the past ten years.

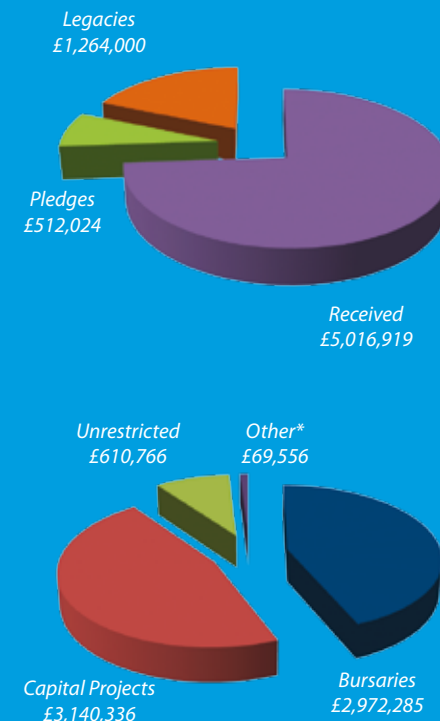

Bursaries

The Development Trust seeks to provide bursaries on entry to pupils who would not otherwise be able to afford a King's School education. There are also limited bursary resources provided through the Wolfson Fund and a number of third party institutions who help to support pupils in the school.

The Fellowship Bursary Fund

The participation of OVs in the fellowship bursary scheme continues to provide critical funds for new pupil bursaries.

This year, the 1964-69 year group, under the leadership of Andrew Reekes (Ch 64-69) was able to provide its first award of a 1/3 bursary to a new pupil joining The King's school in the Sixth Form.

In September 2011 two further Fellowship Bursaries will be awarded, the first funded by the family and former pupils of Bob Burkill (Hon OV) and awarded in his memory, and the second funded by the parents and leavers of 1976-9 in memory of Keith Wightman (Ch 74-79).

The Enduring Bursary Fund

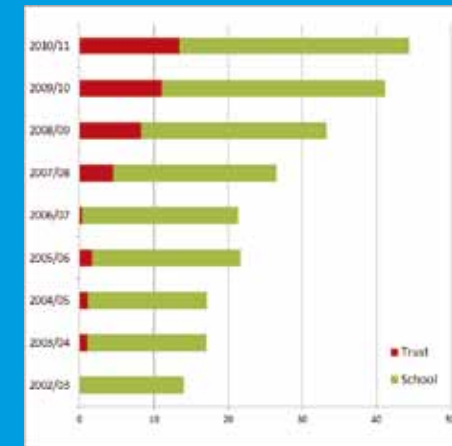
King's does not benefit from a substantial endowment but thanks to the initial donation of £1 million from Michael Baker in 2009 we have now been able to establish an Enduring Bursary Fund with a view to providing means-tested bursaries to King's in perpetuity.

The fund continues to grow with a current value of around £1.3 million. This year, the income from the invested funds has provided financial support to 12 pupils with the equivalent value of 4.5 full fees.

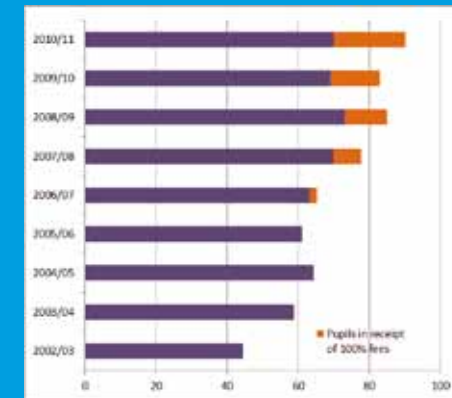
Our long term goal is to increase the fund to support the equivalent of 15 full fee bursaries in any year. This would require a minimum of £4 million to be invested.

From the Chairman of the Investment Committee

The Investment Committee comprises six individuals who meet regularly and report to the Trust three times a year. The Committee has overall responsibility for reviewing and monitoring the investments of the Enduring Bursary Fund. These are made by the appointed Investment Advisor, Nicholas Knapp (W 78-87) of Richings Financial Management.

The investment objective is to at least maintain the value of Enduring Bursary Fund investments in real terms and produce a consistent and sustainable return to support ongoing bursaries. The investment approach, having obtained permission from the Charity Commission, is on a total return to investment basis regardless of whether this is obtained by dividends, interest or capital gains.

In terms of asset allocation, the Investment Advisor has discretion to alter the equity ratio based on market conditions. However the overall equity component of the total fund, reflecting the long term nature of investment decisions, should not exceed 80%. The remainder should be held as fixed interest investments or cash. The investment advisor's performance is reviewed and benchmarked against the FTSE All Share Index adjusted to reflect dividend yields in view of the total return performance target. Performance, although regularly reviewed, is assessed over a rolling three year period. The first funds were allocated to Richings Financial Management in August 2009, with the initial mandate from the Committee to drip feed investments into equity markets in its inaugural year.

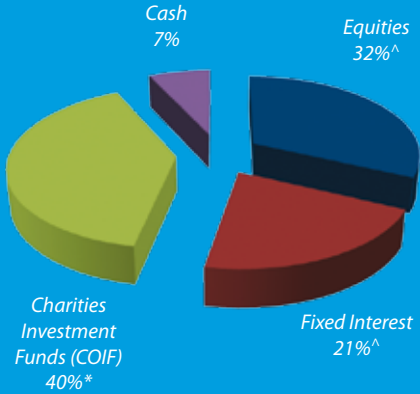
A total of £1,407,074, in principally three tranches, has been handed to the investment advisor for investment since August 2009. It is pleasing to report, in what has been a period of significant market volatility in

all asset classes, that as of 31st July 2011, the value of investments had increased in nominal terms by 11.08% to £1,563,032. The equity percentage at 31st July 2011 was at 60% and has not exceeded this level.

Whilst it was agreed that the starting point for benchmarking annual performance would be from October/November 2010, after the period of drip feeding into equity markets was complete, this is nevertheless an encouraging and pleasing performance. To put this all into context, the amount handed over for investment could support 130.38 years of school fees at that time. The value of investments at 31st July 2011 can support 141.43 years of current school fees, a commendable increase of 11.05 years. Therefore the investments to date have generated a real return of 8.47% in school years supported from which future bursaries can be allocated. A solid start.

A good return

To balance the current and future needs, the Trust aims to:

- Maintain the value of its investments in real terms
- Produce a consistent and sustainable amount to support bursaries
- Deliver these first two objectives with acceptable levels of risk

The Trust manages its Enduring Bursary Fund investments as a whole on a total return basis with a guide of 80 to 20% equities to fixed interest investment. To maximise its freedom and flexibility to invest where it expects returns to be most rewarding, regardless of whether those returns are delivered as income or capital gains, the Trust has obtained an Order from the Charity Commission allowing it to invest to maximise total return and make available an appropriate proportion of the long term return for bursaries each year.



The SPACE will include:

- *A four-court, multi-use Sports Hall with Gym*
- *Two Dance and Drama Studios*
- *A four-storey climbing wall*
- *New teaching and seminar rooms*
- *Expansion of Modern Foreign Languages*
- *A Sixth Form Centre*
- *An entrance and reception foyer linking the SPACE to the John Moore Theatre*
- *A new greenroom for the John Moore Theatre*
- *An underground car park.*

Sports and Performing Arts Centre (SPACE) Project and Campaign

The planning stage of the SPACE campaign is complete and we are now in the 'quiet phase'. This is a period of time when we are actively seeking major donations from individuals before widening out the appeal.

A Campaign Leadership Group has been formed of people who are committed to this project and have agreed to help us to involve other parents and OVs.

This year we have also focused on presenting the plans for the project to the community through parent meetings and a series of events.

A film has been developed by the leadership group and events have been held at

Madresfield Court, at the Engine Rooms of Tower Bridge in the City of London, in Cambridge and in a number of private locations over the course of the year. Parents of OVs have also been invited back to King's to see the developments that have already taken place and our future plans.

In July, the governors took the decision to review the SPACE project plans. They continue to have confidence in the School's ability to finance this project in the near future and plan to starting construction of the first phase in the academic year 2013/14.

In the Spring of 2012 the whole King's Community will be invited to support the school in making this much needed extension of our facilities a reality. If you would like to be involved with this campaign, please contact the Foundation Development Office.

The All Weather Pitch

In 1986, The King's School launched an appeal to fund, amongst other things, a new All-Weather Pitch. The pitch was to be named in memory of Peter Curle, who for many years was the public face of Hockey at King's.

More than £400,000 was raised in this appeal and the money was used for a variety of important projects but we were unable to realise our ambition for the pitch because of planning restrictions placed on the playing fields.

In December this year, we were finally able to complete and officially open this facility.

This vital addition to our sports department also breaks new ground as a project which has been completed in partnership between a local state school and an independent school. The facility is located at Bishop Perowne Church

of England College on land owned by the County Council and is shared equally between the two schools.

The investment has resulted in a valuable amenity being made available to the city as well as providing a facility that is used every day by King's pupils as part of the games programme.

At the end of this report we acknowledge and thank all those who contributed to the 1986-88 King's School Appeal, run by Ian Brown.

The Michael Baker Boathouse

Work was officially started on the Michael Baker Boathouse complex in early December 2010 and good progress has been made throughout the year.

Boats have been stored temporarily in the SPACE car park and training facilities have been set up off-site for rowers. The development has inevitably caused some challenges for the Boat Club and staff but the new complex will transform the opportunities we are able to give our rowers and provide an additional function space and training area on the upper floor for use by the whole school community.

The facility will be officially opened in March 2012 but it is hoped that it will be in use by the end of 2011.

Annual Giving

The King's School Worcester has been running an Annual Giving Campaign since 2006 when it raised just over £4,000. Year by year we have seen the number of participants grow and to date over £50,000 has been donated.

As part of this campaign, parents of leavers are asked to donate their original registration deposit to the fund. This year more than 45% of our parents elected to do this.

Each year, projects are chosen for the Annual Giving Campaign which will have a direct impact on pupils currently at the school. A regular contribution is also made to the Mike Stevens Fund.

Over the next few years, Annual Giving will be focused on helping to support the future Sports and Performing Arts Centre through the SPACE campaign.

The Mike Stevens Fund

Awards up to £1,000 have been made this year from the Mike Stevens Fund to help pupils go on a variety of academic, sporting, pastoral and music tours. An additional grant, the Graham Hollister Short Award, has also been made to a pupil wishing to further her studies in German.

These grants are made to pupils who are key participants in various fields but for whom the additional cost of these tours is beyond their means. Many of the recipients are also in receipt of a means-tested bursary.

The Robert Harley Award

The Robert Harley Award is a financial grant made to a pupil who has displayed enterprise, leadership, endeavour or triumph over adversity and who has a particular project or activity which requires funds.

Robert Harley attended The King's School from 1964-1971. He went on to become an extremely successful businessman and well respected member of the community.

Thanks to the generosity of his widow, we have been able to make this award for the first time this year in his memory.

Inheritance Tax

- *Inheritance Tax is paid if the value of your estate exceeds the threshold set by the government – currently £325,000.*
- *Inheritance tax of 40% is paid on the amount that exceeds this threshold. So, out of every £1 over the threshold your beneficiaries will only keep 60p, 40p will go to the government.*
- *Gifts to charities are generally exempt from Inheritance Tax. If you leave a charitable gift it will be deducted from your estate before Inheritance Tax liability is calculated.*

The Baker Society (for donors over £5,000) invited to private lunches and other events including introductions to pupils. Naming recognition as appropriate.

The Fellowship Group (for donors to the Fellowship Bursary Scheme) invited to lectures and other events and sent regular reports on their bursary pupils' progress.

The 1541 Society (those leaving a legacy) invited to an annual meeting. Previous venues have included the Edgar Tower, House of Lords and Inner Temple.

Legacies

The Development Trust's legacy programme was launched in 2003 and the 1541 Society established to thank and honour in their lifetime those who have chosen to endow the future of the school.

Since that time, 39 OV's and friends of the school have joined the 1541 Society and more than £1,250,000 has been pledged in this way.

In May, we unveiled a number of improvements made to the Cricket Pavilion thanks to a generous legacy left by Ray Godsall (42-50)

During the summer, the Foundation Development Office conducted some telephone research with a view to gaining feedback from the OV community on the communications and events programme.

90% of the OVs interviewed had attended an OV event. The comments made about these were generally very positive; a prevalent comment being how well the events are organised. OVs who have attended the London Dinner over the past few years have been particularly impressed by the venues.

Year groups are the most popular way of organising reunion groups and we will continue to organise most reunions in this way. However, a number of OVs agreed that sports teams and houses might also be popular; this is something we have done in the past and, given your feedback, will aim to do more of over the next few years.

Based on the feedback we received on the City of London drinks we plan to host more industry focused events as this was found to be both enjoyable and useful, particularly for younger OVs wishing to network.

Our email updates continue to be well received; OVs find the information helpful, informative and sent at appropriate intervals.

Connect magazine continues to be popular with all generations of OVs

It was encouraging that most OVs interviewed were interested to read about the Development Trust and how its work is benefitting pupils at King's. Similarly, OVs are interested in the future development plans at school. We have some way to go before the OV and FDO pages of the school website are used to their full potential, but for many they are a useful source of information.
