From the Headmaster



I am delighted that with the easing of Covid restrictions on school life, we have been able to return to a version of 'normality' here at King's and I am very proud of the way in which our pupils and staff have adapted to the new normal. One of the real pleasures of a relaxation in the restrictions has been the fact that I have had the opportunity to meet with a number of Old Vigornians in recent months, both at a series of reunions that

were held in the School Gardens and in College Hall during September, as well as those individual OV's who have made personal trips to visit us here in Worcester. It has been wonderful to see King's Development and Alumni Relations team, Liz, Sophie and Amanda, hosting some hugely successful OV events and meeting up with OV's in and outside School, and I am grateful to them for all their hard work.

I am also very grateful to the Development Trust for the work that they do and to the Trustees for their careful stewardship of donated monies. Whilst all the Trustees share with us their expertise and give up their time for our termly Trust meetings, I must mention in particular Andrew Reekes, who is Chair of the Trust and Fanos Hira, who is Chair of the Investment Committee. It is reassuring that our investments have been carefully managed throughout this challenging economic period and that the bursaries funded from these investments remain an important focus for the Trust, providing life changing opportunities for the young pupils who benefit in such a poignant and impactful way from the generosity of others.

The role of the Trust in supporting the King's Bursary Programme cannot be underestimated. I am incredibly grateful to the OV's and friends of the School who regularly give to this Programme. Throughout this past year, we have been informed of a number of legacies to King's that individuals have included within their wills, and I would like to extend my thanks to all those who choose to remember The Kings School in this way. Without the wonderful generosity from all those who give to King's, we would not be able to continue providing bursarial opportunities for pupils to attend our School.

King's continues to be an excellent school and I am delighted to share with you that your school was ranked as one of the Top 10 independent secondary schools in the West Midlands in the latest *Sunday Times Parent Power Schools Guide*. We don't rest on our laurels however, and we continue to look at ways in which we can enhance our offer; one such example is that this year, we have introduced Psychology A level. Over the last year, I have been working with the Senior Leadership Team here at King's developing our strategy for the future of the School - over the next 7, 14 and 21 years - and I look forward to sharing this with you during 2022.

As ever, it would give me great pleasure to meet with any OV visiting King's; furthermore, I would be delighted to talk with you should you consider providing financial support to the School. I very much look forward to meeting many of you in person over the coming months.

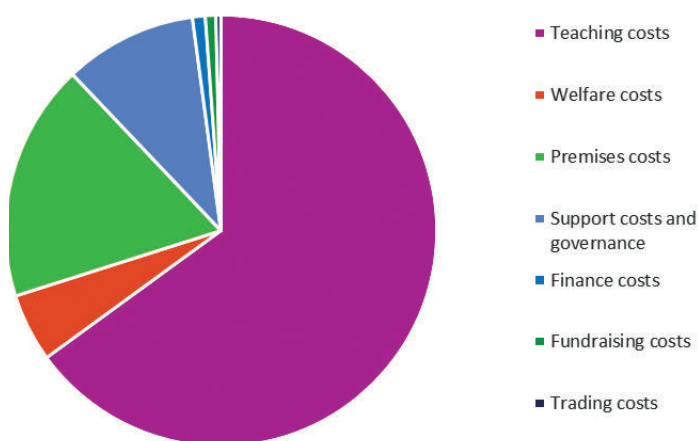

From the Chairman of the Development Trust



After months of enforced hibernation, when Zoom and social media had to do service as our only modes of communication with thousands of OV, parents and friends, there has recently been a very welcome renaissance in Trust activities. The summer and autumn witnessed more visits, reunions and face to face meetings at King's, as the country steadily unlocked and learnt to accommodate itself to coronavirus. At

the same time, it has been a real joy to see our Foundation Director, Liz Elliott back in school and recovered from her battle with serious illness, and to see Sophie Borrillo-McLellan return after maternity leave, having safely delivered Floriana. The Foundation office feels that once again it is operating at full tilt and there is a renewed energy and enthusiasm; it is heartening to witness planning for OV meetings and activities across this coming year.

We have cause to be very grateful to those who kept the Foundation office operating in those most trying of lockdown circumstances: Alice Evans maintained our Twitter and Facebook posts and updated our database while Caroline Mitchell-Wise stepped in very capably to run the office on a temporary basis and to deal with planning future events. Alice has now moved on and we are very grateful to her for her four years' service for the Foundation Trust; she has been replaced by Amanda Sutcliffe, who has very rapidly established herself.

The Trust's focus has for years been wholly upon building up the bursary fund, a recognition that we have a duty to ensure that those children who have much to offer, who can gain significantly from a King's education, and yet who are without the parental means, should be given the opportunity - if at all possible - to have access to the King's School. It might have been expected that severe recession, combined with the shock of coronavirus - which has impacted nationally on independent education - would seriously damage our fund-raising effectiveness. Yet

this has been a very successful year. The Kildare trust, established by OV, **James Lawson Richards**, has, very generously, given the Trust £50k to support our enduring bursary programme. **Mark Haworth**, who lives and works in the USA, has continued to be most munificent and responsive and his major gift this year has made a significant difference to the education of several King's pupils. We have seen the impact of John Foley's promise to pay every year the entirety of the fees for a bursary pupil. We have also had handsome donations from **Julian Slater** and **David Blundell** among others.

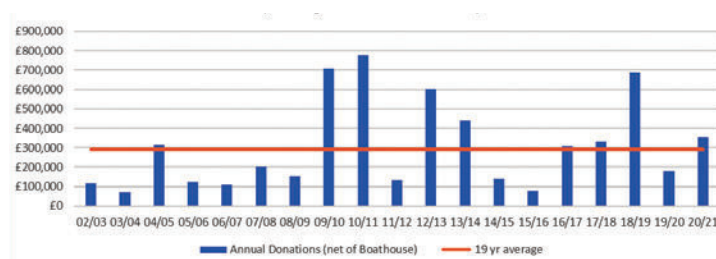
These gifts demonstrate the importance of the work of King's Development & Alumni Relations team in maintaining and cultivating links with OVs and friends of the school; and quite as much, they show the value of legacies gifted to the school. We continue to hear of valuable legacies made to The King's School. In the coming months we will be reminding the King's family of the impact their legacy gifts can have on bursary pupils.

I remain most grateful to my fellow trustees. Their effort in travelling to meetings, their expertise, and their willingness to spend considerable time on debating the correct balance between equity investments and cash, between our Fellowship and our Enduring funds, and that we have realistic expectations as to our fund-raising targets, is all invaluable. Whilst it is invidious to pick out individuals, nevertheless I am especially appreciative of the work **Fanos Hira** has done in chairing our Investment Committee; his partnership with our Investment Manager, **Nick Knapp** OV, first forged when they sat together in King's 6th Form Economics lessons in the 1980s, has been very fruitful, with a particularly strong set of investment figures this year. A third member of that Economics set, **Lewis Bryer** OV, has joined us as our newest trustee this year and we extend a warm welcome to him.

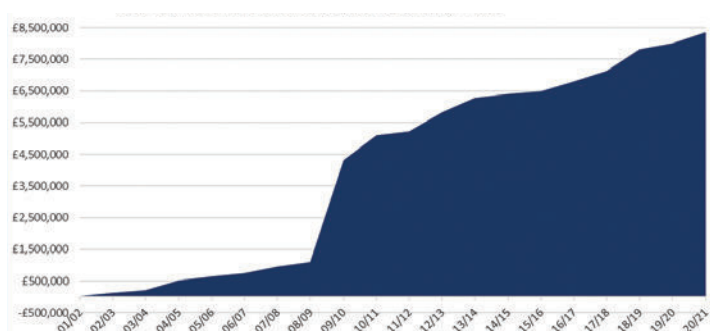

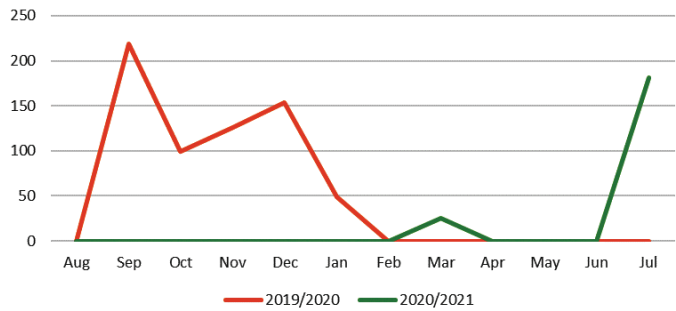
I would like to share with you the thought process behind one of our interesting donations this year. In March this year, OV **David Blundell (Ch, 1948-1955)** got in touch with us, expressing an interest in supporting King's bursaries. David had joined The Kings School in 1948 at the age of ten. King's was David's sixth school, on account of the fact that his parents had separated and he had been fostered at the age of four.

David's education at Kings was paid for by his godfather, Gordon Bancks. Gordon was a highly regarded solicitor, who ran a firm of solicitors in Pershore. He also took his Christian vows seriously, reflected in the commitment to educate and raise his young godson. In later years, Gordon made the decision to join the Catholic church and eventually he was ordained as a priest. David explained that he feels indebted to his godfather, who provided him with a stable childhood and the opportunity to gain a sound education at King's, which led subsequently to a solid and exciting career in Finance. David realises that he was lucky enough to have a benefactor who could provide for his education and he decided that he would like to create a fund at King's in his godfather's memory, which will allow future generations of bursary pupils to benefit from such funding in order to attend our School.

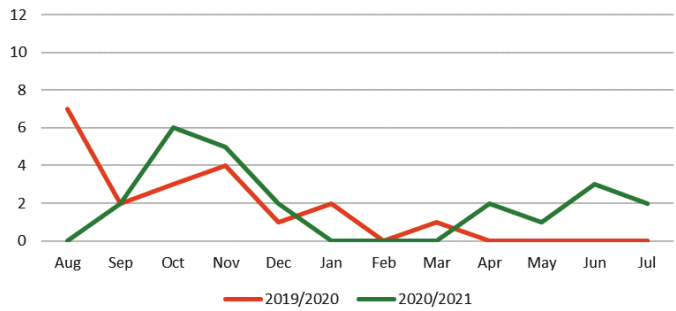
On leaving Kings, David joined Leslie & Godwin, Lloyds insurance brokers with responsibility for placing marine risks with Lloyds. Most of David's career was spent in insurance and financial services. He worked at Equitable Life becoming financial planning manager, Southern region, followed by four-year spells as director of Sedgwick Financial Services, then financial planning manager at Scottish Widows, with responsibility for the tax/financial planning dept and pension transfer unit. At the age of fifty-eight David decided to retire.

David was an active investor since the age of twenty, becoming a name at Lloyds of London in 1991 and he was voted onto the board of Cooper Clarke Plc as a non-executive director to protect the interests of

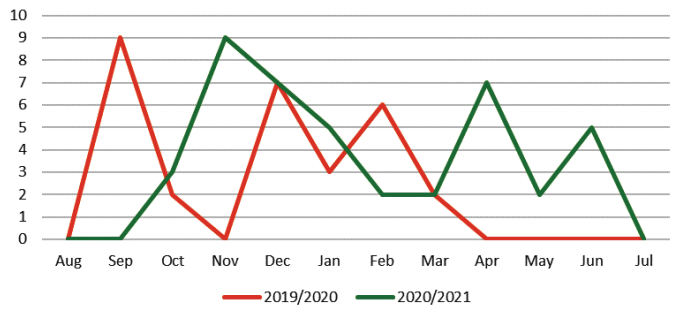
Event Attendees



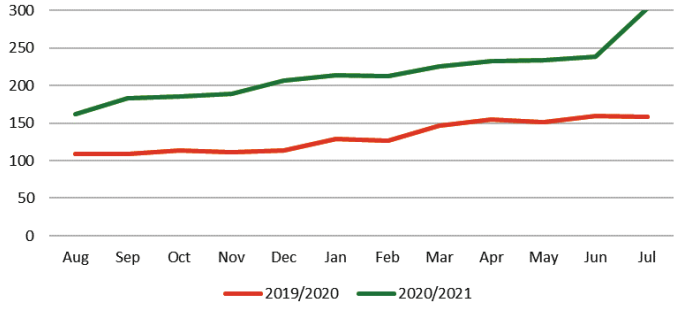
OV Visits to King's School

the minority shareholders; it was taken over with a sevenfold increase in the share value. Other voluntary work followed with an emphasis on protecting the rights of retail investors: director, then chairman of the United Kingdom Shareholders Association and then director of the UK Shareholders Society. David remains Chairman of the Bradford & Bingley Action Group (BBAG), whose objective is to secure and investigate the facts behind the demise of B&B in 2008.

David says, "My motivation for supporting this bursary is that whatever success I may have had is due to the financial support my godfather Gordon Bancks provided for me as a boarder at King's after the divorce of my parents. Gordon Bancks was a devout Christian who was true to his vows on my behalf. He was the best of us."

David and I worked together over the last few months, to arrive at a financial solution, whereby a unique enduring fund has been created – the Bancks Blundell Bursary – to perpetuate the memory of his godfather. This year, we were very grateful for two initial financial donations from David to The King's School Worcester Development Trust; David's intention is to make lifetime contributions in order to grow this Bursary Fund. (The benefit to King's of these lifetime donations, is that gift aid can be applied to supplement the donation by a further 25%). David has also made a provision in his will for a significant bequest to the Trust, which will also be invested in the Bancks Blundell Bursary. Only at this point, will the monies be used to provide funding for a bursary place at King's. David is hopeful that this enduring fund will be sufficient to pay for bursaries at King's for the foreseeable future. The principle – along with the Trust's other enduring investments - is to preserve the capital in the fund and use the interest and growth to pay for pupils' fees, which secures the longevity of our Bursary Programme for generations of future pupils.

We are incredibly grateful to David, for the considered and generous nature of this and future donations, with the creation of a fund which

will provide for many children in the future to benefit from financial support in order to come to King's. If you are interested in finding out more about possible donation options, I would be delighted to talk to you in confidence about your own wishes and priorities. Lifetime gifts can be augmented by gift aid and legacies can be a way of supporting King's either in a major way or as an alternative should you not feel able to give during your lifetime. If you wish to let us know about a legacy to King's in your will, we would be delighted to invite you to become a member of our *1541 Society*. Our *1541 Society* members are warmly welcomed to join us for key school events and to a special Society event each year, by way of expressing our gratitude.

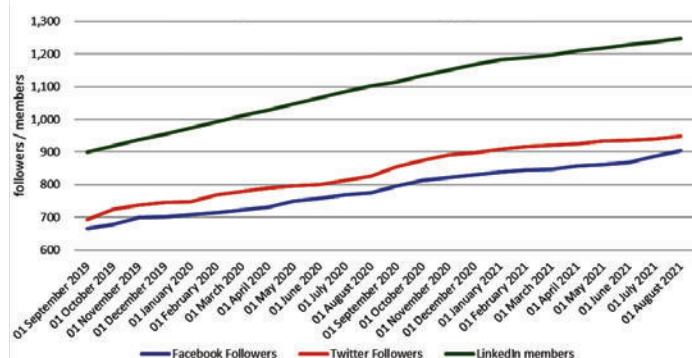

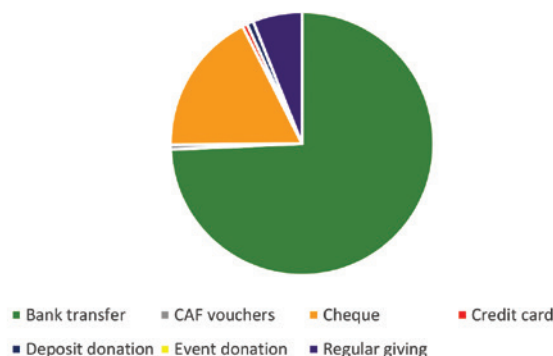

A message from David Seabright (Wulstan, 1964), who has remembered King's in his will.



Well, we've earned it all legally, paid our taxes etc. As Christians, we've been involved with a lot of charities, either by having their newsletters and giving donations, supporting friends financially who are missionaries - both in the UK and abroad - or by being trustees of charities. So, we decided that charities would be the best beneficiaries when it came to doing our wills. As a chartered accountant in practice, I knew the tax rules: that whatever is given to charity would reduce the amount of inheritance tax which would go to the government. And so we have designed our wills in such a way as to be tax free at our deaths.

One of our mantras is "The greatest use of life is to live it for something that will outlast it". Think about it, and you could do something for the future. One thing you could do is to give to King's School as part of their bursary scheme.



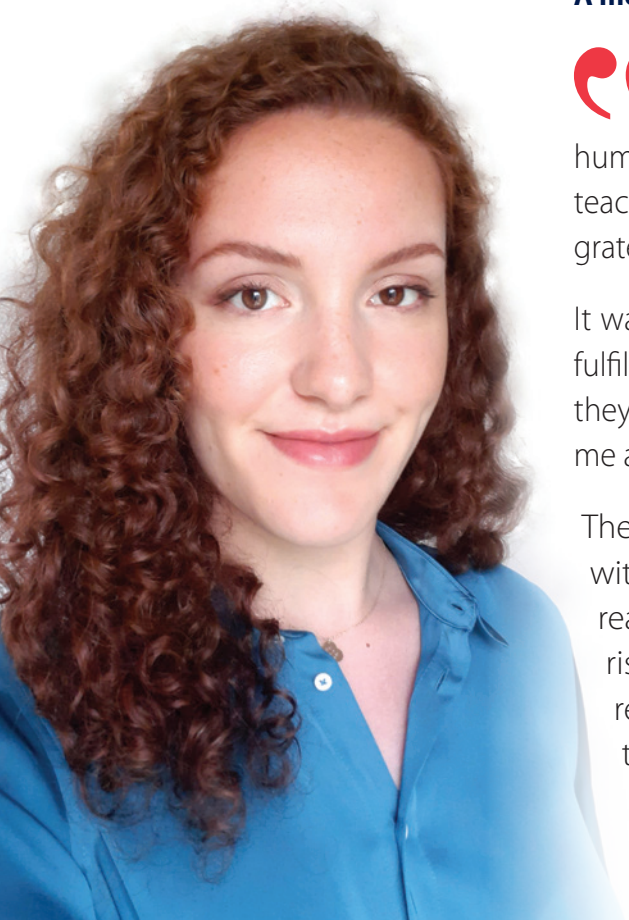
A message from Rebecca Hartley (Bright 2017)
