1. Early help offer

At The King's School, Worcester Foundation (the Foundation) we recognise the challenges that families face in bringing up children. There may be times when you need extra help and support. If this is the case, please come and talk to us. There are many ways in which we can help as outlined in this offer of early help. The diagram below shows the range of needs at different levels. We use this graduated approach to make sure we provide the best support for different families' individual situations.



Providing support to our pupils and families at the Foundation means we are more effective in promoting support as soon as we can. Early help means providing support as soon as a problem emerges at any point in a child's life, from the foundation years through to the teenage years. Early help is support for children of all ages that improves a family's resilience and outcomes or reduces the chance of a problem getting worse. Providing early help is more effective in promoting the welfare of children than reacting later.

All staff are fully trained in all aspects of safeguarding.

3. Meeting the needs of our pupils

Pupil Voice

Pupils are actively encouraged to speak about any concerns they have to any member of staff or to their direct pastoral team. Children are encouraged to speak openly about their emotions. Pupils know the staff take all their concerns very seriously.

At King's Senior School there is a School Council and a Peer Support Scheme for Sixth Form pupils to support Lower Years pupils. Student Voice is an online platform for pupils to report concerns and share feedback. There is also a post box outside the Lower Years offices for pupils to share similar matters.

At King's Hawford pupils are encouraged to approach any member of staff with any concerns they may have. There is a School Council at which concerns may be raised, as well as Eco and Food Committees.

At King's St Alban's pupils are encouraged to speak to their form teacher, one of the matrons, the school secretary or other adults if they have a concern. Children are encouraged to speak openly about their emotions. Pupils know the staff take all their concerns very seriously.

Attendance

At King's Senior School, House and Form staff monitor attendance carefully in line with our Attendance Policy. Attendance is overseen by the Deputy Head (Pastoral) and the Safeguarding Team.

At King's Hawford, Form staff, office staff and the DSL monitor attendance and late arrivals in line with our Attendance Policy.

At King's St Alban's, Form staff, office staff and the DSL monitor attendance and late arrivals in line with our Attendance Policy.

Pastoral Support

At King's Senior School, Harriet Dyke works with pupils and families to support their needs whilst also signposting them to relevant agencies. With the consent of families, we can refer families for further family support.

At King's Hawford, Tom Butt, Caroline Knight and Katie Poole undertake these tasks.

At King's St Alban's, Nick Hawker, Adam Kent and Sarah Pugh undertake these tasks.

Learning Skills and Learning Support

At King's Senior School, Isobel Carron, SENCo, works with children and families with additional needs and can signpost parents and guardians to many different agencies.

At King's Hawford, Vicki English, SENCo, liaises with external agencies in this respect.

At King's St Alban's, Briony Cartwright, SENCo, liaises with external agencies in this respect.

Safeguarding

- All teachers and staff know how to identify and report concerns, via staff training on induction and our regular updates on safeguarding.
- Child protection files are kept by the DSL.
- All new staff complete safeguarding inductions.
- We have a log recording that all staff have read and understood relevant sections of Keeping Children Safe in Education (September 2024).
- The DSL and DDSL in all three schools ensure rigorous and robust systems are in place within the School to ensure the safety of all of our children.

In Keeping Children Safe in Education 2024 it makes it clear that ALL staff should be aware of their local early help process and understand their role in it. In addition, this statutory document makes it clear that any child may benefit from early help, but all school and college staff should be particularly alert to the potential need for early help for a child who:

- is disabled or has certain health conditions and has specific additional needs
- has special educational needs (whether or not they have a statutory Education, Health and Care plan)
- has a mental health need
- is a young carer
- is showing signs of being drawn in to anti-social or criminal behaviour, including gang involvement and association with organised crime groups or county lines
- is frequently missing/goes missing from education, home or care
- has experienced multiple suspensions, is at risk of being permanently excluded from schools, colleges and in Alternative Provision or a Pupil Referral Unit
- is at risk of modern slavery, trafficking, sexual and/or criminal exploitation
- is at risk of being radicalised or exploited
- has a parent or carer in custody, or is affected by parental offending
- is in a family circumstance presenting challenges for the child, such as drug and alcohol misuse, adult mental health issues and domestic abuse
- is misusing alcohol and other drugs themselves
- is at risk of so-called 'honour'-based abuse such as Female Genital Mutilation or Forced Marriage
- is a privately fostered child.

Everyone needs help at some time in their lives and therefore an ethos of early help is important for any school.

The coordinated Foundation offer of Support for Families is outlined in the table below. We believe that early interventions for children or families, in many cases, will prevent children from experiencing harm.

All Foundation staff must be aware of the offer of early help. At all times, staff should consider if there is any offer of early help that we can make in order to help a child thrive.

What is our Early Help offer?	<p>What is Early Help?</p> <p>Early Help means providing support as soon as a problem appears, to stop it from getting worse. This could be at any point in a child's life, from birth to the teenage years.</p> <p>Anyone can provide early help – you don't need to be an expert professional.
