Holding a Scholarship at King's



At King's we recognise and reward outstanding performance through the provision of scholarship awards. Scholarships are sought-after roles and are awarded based on achievement and potential in the chosen areas.



A scholarship therefore represents a partnership between the school, the pupil, and their parents, with shared expectations of commitment and engagement.

EXPECTATIONS

Scholars are expected to embody the school's values through enthusiasm for learning, active participation in school life and the curriculum, and demonstrating commitment and curiosity. As a scholarship pupil, your role is not only to reach your full potential but also to inspire and support your fellow students in their academic pursuits.

Those awarded scholarships are expected to:

Academic Commitment

Maintain high academic standards, showing consistent effort, organisation, and positive engagement in lessons and independent study.

Behaviour and Conduct

They must always uphold the school's standards of behaviour, treating staff, peers, and the wider community with respect and acting as positive role models.

Contribute to School Life

Contribute actively to school life through full participation in co curricular activities, supporting school events such as sporting fixtures, concerts, drama performances and art exhibitions, and acting as a positive ambassador for the school and their scholarship department

Attitude and Engagement

Across all disciplines, they should demonstrate enthusiasm, commitment, and pride in their area of scholarship, helping to foster a positive and inclusive community.

Support

We will provide the guidance, challenge and encouragement needed to fulfil your potential. Our dedicated and experienced teachers are deeply committed to helping you succeed.

Enrichment

You will have access to a wide range of enrichment opportunities beyond the classroom, designed to deepen intellectual curiosity, develop talent and support ambition within your area of scholarship.

Mentoring

Your strengths and potential will be recognised and nurtured through mentoring and opportunities to grow in confidence, leadership and independence.

Applications are welcomed for multiple scholarships. Where pupils hold more than one scholarship, staff across departments collectively work with them to help to ensure that they balance their commitments accordingly. **Please note:** no combined award would exceed 40% of fees.

DEFINITIONS

Scholarship:

A scholarship is a fee remission award (a reduction in the amount of fees payable) which recognises a pupil with exceptional ability. Scholarship awards are between 5% and 20% reduction in fees. No combined award would exceed 40% of fees.

Pupils who are awarded scholarships continue to receive them throughout their time at King's Senior and Sixth Form, subject to continued effort and adherence to Scholarship terms and conditions. Performance is reviewed and assessed annually and scholars informed of their progress.

Bursary:

A means-tested fee remission provided to help families on a lower income support their academically able children (a reduction in the amount of fees payable of up to 100%). These are assessed independently of the Scholarship.

Academic Scholarships

At King's Worcester, pupils are encouraged to excel in everything they do. High academic standards underpin school life, and outcomes at GCSE and in the Sixth Form reflect both ambition and strong progress.

An academic scholarship is an award made to a child who shows a high level of academic attainment and intellectual curiosity in our entrance assessments.

We will support academic scholars to achieve excellence through a wealth of opportunities such as national debating forums, national competitions and leadership opportunities.

In addition to the academic clubs open to all pupils, scholars are required to participate in the Academic Enrichment Programme. This stimulates intellectual discussion in a variety of session styles and speakers, including staff, pupils, and external guests.

Academic Scholars are expected to demonstrate a sustained commitment to intellectual excellence.

Pupils are expected to:

- ♦ Perform consistently at the top of their year group
- ♦ Produce work of an exceptionally high standard
- ♦ Demonstrate intellectual curiosity beyond the taught curriculum
- ♦ Engage in academic enrichment programme activities such as:
 - ♦ Academic clubs
 - ♦ Competitions
 - ♦ Lectures and wider reading
- ♦ Represent the school in academic competitions
- ♦ Act as a role model in the classroom
- ♦ Support and mentor other pupils

Sixth Form Academic Scholar are expected to:

- ♦ Demonstrate advanced subject engagement through:
 - ♦ Independent research
 - ♦ Extended reading
 - ♦ Preparation for competitive university applications and further educational opportunities.

Academic Scholarship Assessment

- ♦ All applicants sitting an entrance assessment at II+, I3+ are automatically considered for an academic scholarship.
- ♦ II+ pupils from our Prep Schools are also required to sit the entrance assessment to be considered for a scholarship.
- ♦ I6+ applicants are required to sit an academic assessment.

Art Scholarships

Our Art Scholarship programme aims to support committed and passionate pupils eager to refine and expand their artistic skills.

Our highly regarded Art School offers a dynamic and inspiring environment that celebrates each student's individuality and artistic potential. Through our Scholarship programme, they embark on a rich and challenging journey of creative growth and self-discovery. Through offering one-to-one mentoring and ongoing support, we are committed to nurturing imagination and developing a broad range of artistic skills, providing the necessary support

to help prepare students for university or art college, as appropriate.

Pupils are supported in deepening their understanding of both historical and contemporary art, while exploring every aspect of art-making and visual expression.

Art Scholars are expected to demonstrate creativity, commitment, and technical development.

Pupils are expected to:

- ♦ Be confident and innovative artists or designers who regularly practise their skill
- ♦ Contribute to the visual culture of the school
- ♦ Maintain a high-quality and evolving portfolio that demonstrates their skill as an artist or designer
- ♦ Participate in enrichment activities such as art clubs, workshops, competitions, and exhibitions
- ♦ Show a high level of technical skill as well as demonstrating a creative, original, and personal approach to their work
- ♦ Choose GCSE Art as one of their options

Sixth Form Art Scholars are expected to:

- ♦ Produce a highly developed personal portfolio
- ♦ Curate exhibitions, support open days, taster days and transition events
- ♦ Participate in enrichment activities and mentor Lower Years pupils



Art Scholarship Assessment

11+ (Year 7)

Applicants are required to:

- ♦ Provide a portfolio of work, comprising 12 pieces of non-school work, to include drawing and evidence of interest and personal specialism, such as and not limited to sketching, painting, 3D, textiles, sculpture
- ♦ Join an informal workshop on Saturday for 2 hours, meeting with the Head of Art and members of the Art Department.

13+ (Year 9) and 16+ (Year 12)

Applicants are required to join us on the 13+ Assessment Day, where they will be required to:

- ♦ Bring a portfolio of work, comprising 12 pieces of non-school work, to include drawing and evidence of interest and personal specialism, such as and not limited to sketching, painting, 3D, textiles, sculpture
- ♦ Meet with the Head of Art to discuss their portfolio of work and artistic interests
- ♦ Join an informal 2-hour workshop.

Choristers

Chorister Scholarships at King's Worcester offer musically talented pupils the opportunity to develop their singing within one of the School's most distinctive and historic traditions.

Rooted in our long-standing partnership with neighbouring Worcester Cathedral, the programme provides exceptional musical training alongside an ambitious and well-rounded education.

As members of Worcester Cathedral Choir, choristers benefit from regular opportunities to sing a wide and demanding repertoire within a professional musical environment. This experience develops musical literacy, sight-reading, vocal technique, language skills and ensemble awareness to a high standard, while fostering discipline, resilience and confidence. Commitments are carefully balanced within the school day to ensure pupils can fully engage with academic and co-curricular life.

Pupils are expected to:

- ♦ Perform regularly with the Cathedral Choir, attending rehearsals, services and concerts as required
- ♦ Demonstrate the potential to reach the highest standards of musical performance and vocal technique
- ♦ Show a strong enthusiasm for music and singing
- ♦ Maintain a high level of commitment, organisation and reliability
- ♦ Contribute actively to the wider musical life of the School
- ♦ Act as positive role models and ambassadors for choral music at King's

Through this rich and rewarding experience, choristers develop both musical excellence and personal confidence, preparing them for continued success in music and beyond.

Choristers receive specialist tuition and are supported by dedicated music and pastoral staff from King's and Worcester Cathedral. Further to the regular service schedule at the cathedral, choristers also have the opportunity to take part in concerts, tours, broadcasts on television and radio, and recordings, they are encouraged to contribute widely to the musical life of the school, taking part in choirs, ensembles and performances across the year.

Choristers are expected to demonstrate commitment, musicality and teamwork.



Chorister Assessment

Applications are welcomed from Year 2 (age 7) to Year 7 (aged 11). Applicants are invited to attend a friendly voice trial, typically involving the performance of a prepared hymn or song. In addition, candidates are required to:

- ♦ Undertake simple listening and echo tests to assess pitch, musical ear and responsiveness.

- ♦ Read aloud to assess clarity of diction and pronunciation.

The assessment focuses on vocal potential, musical instinct and willingness to learn, rather than prior formal training. Selection is based on overall suitability for the demands of cathedral choir life, including commitment, reliability and enthusiasm, and the availability of places in the choir in any given year group.

Drama Scholarships

The Drama and Dance Department at King's Worcester functions as a professional theatre space, hosting productions that consistently draw sold-out audiences.

Pupils benefit from the guidance of an experienced team of drama, dance, and theatre technicians. Many alumni have gone on to build successful careers in various fields of the Performing Arts.

At King's, we aim to instil a love for the theatre and its varied art forms through a blend of practical, intellectual, and creative activities. Our school calendar includes an array of annual productions of plays and musicals as well as a series of more intimate, pupil-led, performances. We support pupils through to the highest level of LAMDA, to huge stage productions, whilst also supporting those

who enjoy the challenge of backstage theatre productions.

From 11+ (Year 7) Drama Scholars also have the opportunity to be part of the school's Spotlight Development Programme – this offers a unique opportunity for pupils to enhance their skills through core, classical repertoire (with an additional musical theatre strand available for selected pupils). Spotlight prepares pupils for future external auditions and instils a deep sense of accomplishment and growth.

Drama Scholars are required to play an active part in the performing arts provision.

Pupils are expected to:

- ♦ Audition for and participate in school productions and showcases
- ♦ Attend all rehearsals and drama workshops, including evening rehearsals and occasional weekends.
- ♦ Demonstrate creativity, confidence, and collaboration
- ♦ Contribute to both performance and, where appropriate, technical, or backstage roles
- ♦ Commit to intensive rehearsal schedules prior to performances
- ♦ Regular audience member at live theatre
- ♦ Select GCSE Drama as one of their options

Sixth Form Drama Scholars are expected to:

- ♦ Take leading roles in productions
- ♦ Support directing and mentoring
- ♦ Contribute to the wider development of the drama programme

Drama Scholarship Assessment

11+ (Year 7)

Applicants are required to:

- Provide a personal statement which outlines their enthusiasm for drama, highlighting their experiences and enjoyment of performance and creativity to include examples of participation school or external productions.
- Attend an audition style drama workshop which will include:
 - Practical workshop
 - Informal interview about recent experiences and drama interests
 - Performance in your chose discipline

13+ (Year 9) and 16+ (Year 12)

Applicants are required to:

- Provide a personal statement which outlines their enthusiasm for drama, highlighting their experiences and enjoyment of performance and creativity, including examples of participation in school or external productions.
- Be invited to a Drama Scholarship Assessment, which will include an individual performance in a chosen discipline, participation in a drama lesson and interview about experience and interests with the Head of Drama.

Music Scholarships



Music is a significant part of life at King's, and the music department has long been a centre of excellence, maintaining strong links with Worcester Cathedral and the musical life of the city.

Music is a significant part of life at King's, and the music department has long been a centre of excellence, maintaining strong links with Worcester Cathedral and the musical life of the city.

Those pupils who have a musical flair and passion could be eligible for music scholarships. There is a wide range of styles and genres of music, including orchestras, wind and jazz bands and solo concerts, allowing pupils to demonstrate and enhance their musical talents. There is also access to outstanding music facilities, first class teaching and mentoring from specialist teaching staff and peripatetic music teachers.

Music Scholars have an annual review with music staff and set targets each year. Many King's pupils have gone on to study Music at Oxbridge, Russell Group universities and Music Colleges before going on to have careers as professional musicians. Bespoke support is provided in preparation for auditions such as aural skills coaching, Bach Chorales, essay writing and performance coaching.

Music Scholars are expected to play a full part in musical life at the school and have a real passion for making music supporting the wider music community.

Pupils are expected to:

- Perform regularly in school concerts and events (evening concerts and occasional weekend performances)
- Participate in instrumental ensembles and choirs (several rehearsals each week)
- Maintain a disciplined programme of individual practice
- Take regular lessons in their principal instrument
- Be prepared to perform as soloists
- Study for graded examinations in practical music and theory
- Support the wider music community
- Encourage and collaborate with younger pupils
- Select Music as a GCSE option

Sixth Form Music Scholars are expected to:

- Take leadership roles within ensembles
- Assist with organisation of concerts and musical events

Music Scholarship Assessment

- Year 7 (II+) candidates are invited to join us on our Music Scholarship Audition Days.
- Assessment takes the form of an instrument or vocal performance of two contrasting pieces of music.
- If a second instrument is offered (which is not mandatory), one piece of music is required.
- It is expected that the applicant will be at the AB/TCL standard below on his or her chosen instrument. II+ (Year 7) Grade 4, I3+ (Year 9) Grade 5, I6+ (Year I2) Grade 7 (Grade 5 for the second instrument)

Sports Scholarships



King's Worcester is synonymous with sporting excellence. Our sporting achievements are extensive, with teams and individual pupils regularly competing at county, regional and national level.

Sports Scholars are talented pupils who relish the challenge of competing at the highest levels of school sport. They are expected to lead by example, both on and off the field, and are required to set high standards in training and matches, contributing significantly to the school's sporting success.

Sports Scholars are enrolled on our Athlete Development Programme, which provides them, sessions from our Strength and Conditioning Coach, termly lectures and mentoring (where required).

Pupils are expected to:

- ♦ Represent the school in their principal sport(s) (compete in all fixtures, including weekends)*
- ♦ Attend multiple training sessions during the school week
- ♦ Maintain high standards of fitness and preparation
- ♦ Demonstrate discipline, resilience, and sportsmanship
- ♦ Balance sporting commitments with academic responsibilities
- ♦ Prioritise school fixtures and practises*
- ♦ Support with School Open Events.
- ♦ Participate in the Athlete Development Programme.
- ♦ Active involvement in school sport across all three terms, including participation beyond their primary sport to support the wider school programme.

**Where pupils are committed to an external club or team exceptions may be granted on individual basis by the Foundation Director of Sport or Director of Sport.*

Sixth Form Sports Scholars are expected to:

- ♦ Exhibit strong leadership qualities and contribute positively to the culture and standards of school sport both on and off the field
- ♦ Act as ambassadors at internal and external events

Sports Scholarship Assessment

Sports Scholarships will be awarded to those who demonstrate the ability to progress and achieve high levels of success.

In addition to completing the scholarship application form, applications are required to:

11+ (Year 7)

- Attend the Sports Scholarship Assessment morning - taking part in a series of physical activities and meeting with the Foundation Director of Sport/ Senior School Director of Sport.

13+ (Year 9)

- Be playing at or have the potential to reach county, regional or national level

- Represent two sports as a minimum at club and school level
- Be invited to a Sports Scholarship Assessment morning, which will include participation in at least one of your chosen sports and informal interview with Foundation Director of Sport or Director of Sport.

16+ (Year 12)

- Be at regional level or equivalent for rugby, hockey, football, netball, athletics, cricket, rowing and swimming where such opportunities exist
- Be invited to a Sports Scholarship Assessment, which will include participation in at least one chosen sport and informal interview with Foundation Director of Sport or Director of Sport.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the benefits of being a Scholar at King's Worcester?

Being a Scholar at King's Worcester offers recognition for exceptional ability alongside extensive academic and co curricular support. Scholars benefit from expert teaching, mentoring and encouragement tailored to their strengths, helping them to stretch their potential with confidence and ambition.

They have access to a wide range of enrichment opportunities beyond the classroom, designed to deepen intellectual curiosity, develop talent and support future aspirations within their area of scholarship. Scholars are also part of a distinctive and supportive community, where leadership, collaboration and personal growth are actively encouraged, and where pupils are given opportunities to build confidence, responsibility and independence while making a meaningful contribution to school life.

Can my child apply for more than one scholarship?

Yes, applicants are welcome to apply for more than one scholarship. Where pupils hold more than one scholarship, staff across departments collectively work with them to help to ensure that they balance their commitments accordingly.

What are the expectations of my child as a King's Worcester Scholar?

A King's Worcester Scholarship recognises both achievement and potential and comes with shared expectations between the school, the pupil and their family. Scholars are expected to set a positive example by working to a high academic standard, showing commitment, organisation and enthusiasm in lessons and independent study. They should consistently uphold the school's standards of behaviour, treating others with respect and acting as

positive role models within the community.

Scholars are also expected to contribute actively to school life, engaging fully in co curricular activities and supporting events and performances as ambassadors for King's and for their scholarship area. Across all disciplines, scholars are encouraged to show curiosity, pride and commitment, not only striving for personal excellence but also inspiring and supporting their peers.

What do we need to do apply for a scholarship?

To apply for a scholarship at King's, you will need to complete your application to the school first and then via our only admissions portal OpenApply you will have the opportunity to complete a scholarship application. Our Admissions Team can guide you through the process and support along the way, should you require any additional help.

Can I apply for a scholarship and bursary?

Yes. Scholarships and bursaries serve different purposes and are assessed separately, so families may apply for one or both.

A Scholarship recognises pupils who demonstrate exceptional ability. It is awarded as a fee remission of between 5% and 20% and reflects talent and potential rather than financial need. A Bursary is a means tested fee remission, awarded to support families on a lower income. Bursaries can cover up to 100% of fees and are assessed independently from scholarships, based on a family's financial circumstances.

Where a pupil is awarded both a scholarship and a bursary, the combined level of fee remission is carefully considered in line with school policy.



What is the financial value of a scholarship at King's Worcester?

Scholarship awards are between 5% and 20% reduction in fees. No combined award would exceed 40% of fees.

I am already a student at King's Worcester; can I apply for scholarship?

As you transition from King's Hawford or King's St Alban's you will be provided with information on how to apply for Scholarships.

I can't make the assessment date; can I be assessed at another time?

Where possible we will assess candidates outside of the application deadlines, however if you have applied outside of our scholarship timeframes, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to offer a scholarship. Bursaries

King's recognises the significant sacrifice that many parents make to enable their children to benefit from an independent school education.

We passionately believe that talented children should be able to enjoy all that a King's education can offer, regardless of background or parental income. Our bursaries can amount up to 100% of school fees and are means-tested. They are specifically targeted towards those applicants who would benefit most from this life-changing opportunity, and many of our most successful pupils are testament to our bursaries' success.

Entrance Bursaries are awarded primarily to pupils entering the school at the ages of 11, 13 and 16. Depending on the availability of funds, Entrance Bursaries may be awarded to a pupil entering the senior school at other ages. Entrance Bursaries would not usually be available to children entering at a prep school level other than in exceptional circumstances.

Who decides on the level of bursary awarded?

King's bursaries are decided by a panel who meet to review applications and the level of awards. The members of the panel are from the school leadership team and the Finance Department.

Does a bursary last a pupil's whole school career?

Bursaries are reassessed annually and, assuming financial circumstances do not change, it is usual for a pupil to receive a bursary from the date of award until they leave.

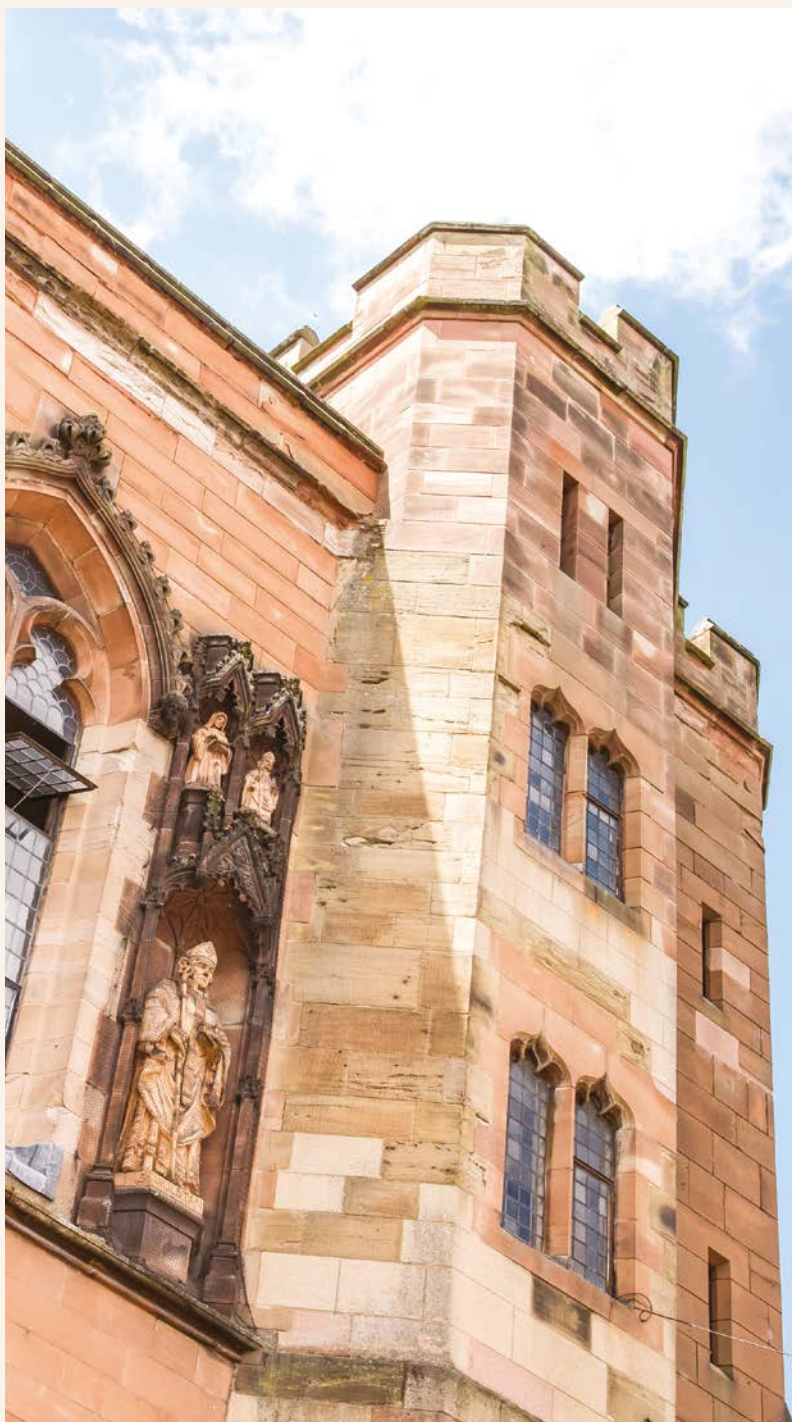
Who is eligible?

- We often have high demand for our bursaries and, as such, it is not usually possible to offer funding to all those who apply for a bursary and get offered a place. When distributing the bursary funds, we also consider a pupil's academic performance.
- The granting of a bursary is discretionary. In making our decisions, we consider a wide range of financial circumstances, including, but not limited to, parental/ guardian income (from all sources), assets (including personal property) and other matters that are particular to the pupil such as family circumstances.
- The value of financial support given can be up to 100% of full school fees*. Grants may also be available to cover or contribute towards the costs of items such as school lunches, uniform, travel costs, equipment required for educational, sports or co-curricular activities, foreign exchange and other educationally important activities.

At King's we treat each application individually and we do not publish a scale of fees payable based on household income.

First-Class Facilities

In the heart of Worcester, King's effortlessly blends contemporary architecture and ancient history. On its peaceful riverside campus, historic buildings sit alongside sophisticated architecture and purpose-built facilities that provide pupils with unsurpassed opportunities.

Academic

Our outstanding academic facilities are well designed and well equipped to enable the very best teaching and learning experiences. This includes classrooms equipped with the latest technology, breakout spaces that facilitate groupwork, individual study areas, an award-winning Library and a dedicated Sixth Form centre.

Music

The Music School includes a range of well-equipped teaching and practice rooms. The Elgar Room includes twenty-five workstations with Cubase and Sibelius software, with facilities to record any work directly into the teacher's computer. The Music School also accommodates rehearsal space, a drum studio, and twelve teaching and practice rooms. Pupils can perform at a range of spaces, including the 300-seat John Moore Theatre, College Hall, and in the historic surrounds of Worcester Cathedral.

Sport

Our sports facilities are outstanding: a state-of-the-art, national-standard

sports hall, an indoor climbing wall, a fitness suite, and a twenty-five metre, indoor, heated swimming pool. The award-winning Michael Baker Boathouse juts out over the river alongside the school, while across the river we have forty-six acres of playing fields and courts, in addition the school's all-weather surface, only short drive from the school.

Drama

Our exceptional facilities include the Wightman Studio, fully equipped to industry standard with computerised lighting, sound, and projection facilities, the Crow dance studio, with a sprung wooden floor and integrated sound system, as well as the 300-seat John Moore Theatre.

Art

Our beautiful Art School is purpose-built and spread over three floors; it has five studios, a gallery, offices and a library, workshops, ceramics, printmaking and ICT facilities. Sixth Form students are allocated their own space, which offers an experience more akin to a university education than a traditional school.
